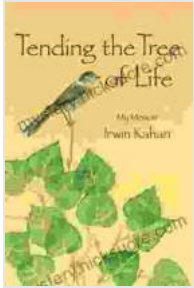
The Importance of Sensitivity

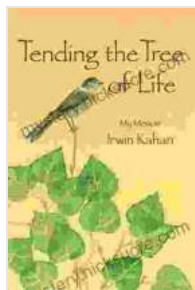

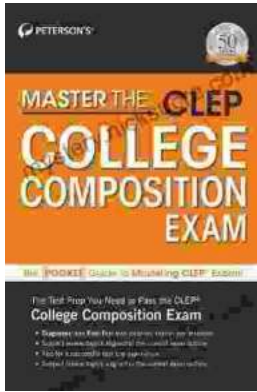
