Your is your chance to summarize your key points and restate your purpose. What are the main reasons why you should be offered a place on the course? Why are you the best candidate for the job?

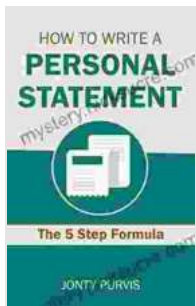
End with a strong call to action. Thank the admissions tutor for their time and consideration, and express your hope that you'll be offered a place on the course.

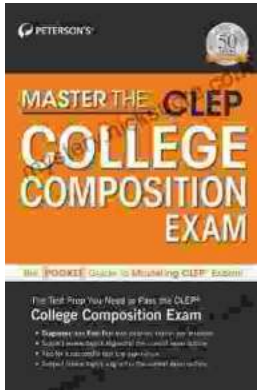
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
